The toilet people will be auctioned later this year, to raise money for eco-sanitation toilets for 20,000 of the poorest people in the Cuddalore district of south-eastern India. Sanitation not only saves lives and creates healthier and richer communities, but these facilities provide a never before known self-respect and dignity. Hence the title of our creative arts campaign - Doorway to Dignity.

Why Sanitation?

Sanitation saves lives.

Every single day 6,000 people die from diarrhoea, 5,000 of whom are children aged under five.

Most people with no sanitation facilities are very poor and are trapped in a vicious cycle of ill-health and poverty. They are often sick, so miss out on education and cannot work regularly.

Many aid programmes pour money into projects that fail because the local people are not healthy enough to make use of them.

The basis of well being is good health, and the basis of good health is good sanitation.

It has an even greater impact than clean water.

Wherever the Need champion the use of eco-sanitation (composting) toilets, which are clean, disease free and produce valuable agricultural fertiliser and compost from



what many people regard as waste. These toilets last for decades, help produce higher crop yields, save water sources from pollution and help restore people's dignity.

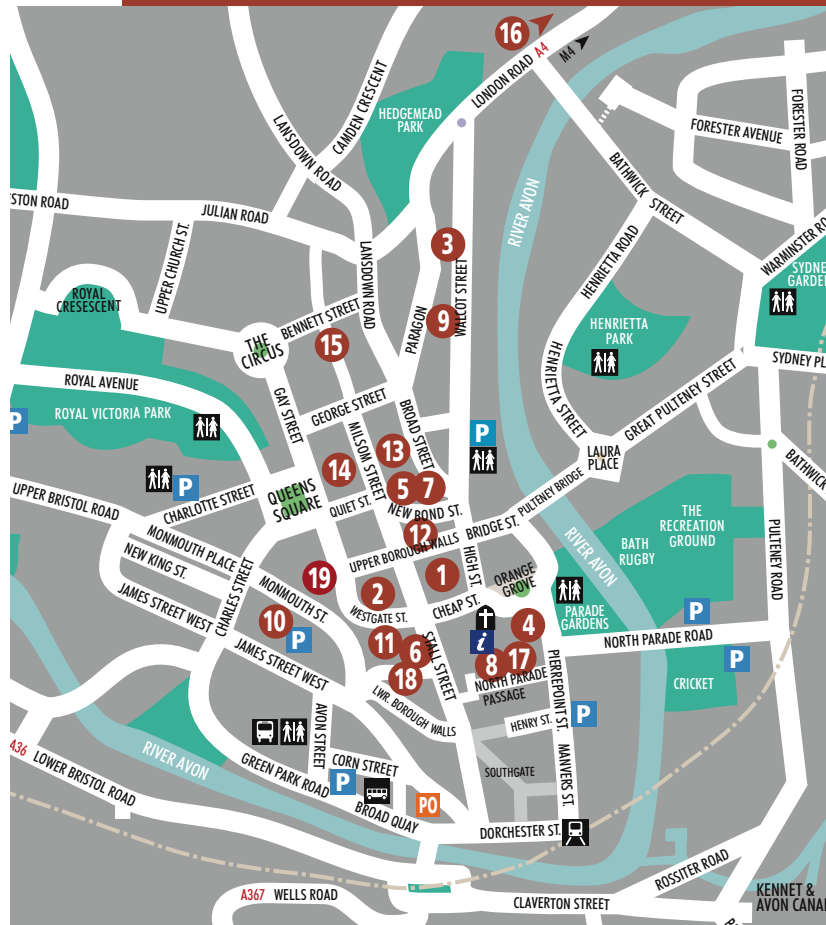

You may think public toilets in Bath are grim, but what if you were one of the 40% of the world who have none?

We take for granted the fact that we can use a toilet whenever we want. But for some 2.5 billion people, that option is not available.

● Every day these people defecate in the open. That amounts to approximately 45 million tonnes of human waste per day polluting waterways, water sources and fields.

● More people die from water related illnesses such as cholera, typhoid and diarrhoea than from HIV/AIDs, malaria and measles combined.

● 4 out of 10 children in the developing world, that's 5,000 a day, die from intestinal illness.

● Every day half the hospital beds in the developing world are occupied by patients suffering unnecessarily from water-borne diseases.

This problem is the least discussed and most poorly funded of all sectors of humanitarian assistance. This is why we established Doorway to Dignity.
